Graduate Education Advancement Board Fellowship

The Graduate Education Advancement Board (GEAB) Fellowship is designed to recruit, support, and encourage exceptional graduate level students, from all fields, who will study and conduct research. The Graduate School will award up to 10 awards of up to \$2,500.00 each for Spring 2019 (funds must be used by April 30, 2019). *Nominees must be current UGA graduate students*. Dissertation Completion Award

The Dissertation Completion Awards are designed to assist doctoral students who are writing their dissertations and **expect to defend and graduate no later than August of the year following the year the award is received**. These awards enable students to concentrate on research and writing to ensure timely degree completion. Recipients will be required to register for 12 graduate credit hours, fall and spring semesters, and should have no teaching responsibilities during the award period.

P.E.O. Scholars Award

The Philanthropic Educational Organization (P.E.O.) is comprised of women who are committed to helping women pursue higher education. The Scholars Award is one of six projects the organization administers. Boyd Memorial Scholarship

The purpose of this scholarship is to attract and retain graduate students to UGA. Recipients should be persons with the philosophy of giving back to the community the best that they have to offer; persons of real distinction, high moral standards, high academic standards, intelligence, interested in the problems of the University and the problems of the nation; and persons interested in the preservation of mankind and the environment. Scholarships may be renewed subject to annual review.

Fanning Graduate Fellowship

The purpose of this scholarship is to provide fellowship support to a student(s) in good standing with excellent leadership qualities and demonstrated financial need. Requirements are exemplary leadership, academic accomplishment, letter of support from the graduate coordinator describing leadership qualities of nominated student, and financial need demonstrated by the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

Beverly Hirsh Frank Graduate Fellowship for Women in Science

The purpose of this fellowship is to recruit, support, and encourage exceptional graduate-level study and research in all fields of life and physical sciences with emphasis in interdisciplinary and emerging fields.

The University of Women's Club Scholarship Fund

This fund provides one scholarship to a graduate student who is a resident of Georgia. The candidate must be a Georgia resident with a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.5 in graduate coursework. A form for advancement to doctoral candidacy must be on file in the Graduate School by the nomination deadline. The nominee must be conducting dissertation research during the year of the award.
